Water water everywhere!

As I sit down to write this foreword the sun is shining and the birds are tweeting, a stark contrast to the month of March. The Tairawhiti region has seen repeated 100 year rainfall events causing significant damage from Tokomaru Bay in the north to Te Karaka and Tiniroto in the West. Up to the end of March, Turihaua has had 665ml; this equates to over half of our annual rain fall in historically the driest part of the year. We are certainly living in strange times.

We are finally seeing the benefits of our environmental plan coming to fruition. For 13 years we have been building resilience into the land using biological inputs, rotational grazing, fencing, and planting our water ways with a goal of improving soil organic matter, water infiltration and reducing runoff. Each 1 percent increase in soil organic matter helps



soil hold 75,000 litres more water per acre, a significant and important amount in the current environmental extremes we are experiencing. We are also lucky that the contour and aspect of this property allows the water to run off without causing too much damage.

Our thoughts go out to our friends, clients and family that have been affected by the weather events. We all know the farming community are a resilient bunch and will get through this.

The weather has also had a big impact on our weaning this year. With so much rain in the forecast we pulled the pin on yard weaning and ran the calves out to their respective paddocks. The 200-day weights have been collected with the top performing sires being Torpedo, Hulk and Dynamite; no surprises there.

We are really excited about the line-up of bulls this season. The consistency and uniformity that we are aiming to achieve is starting to shine through. There will be quality bulls right down the catalogue. BIDR are supporting us again this year with their online bidding platform to run in conjunction with the live auction. So, if you don't think you can make it to the sale you will still have an opportunity to participate. There is also now cell phone reception at the rostrum.

A big thank you to our staff Ollie Jonasen and Duncan Quinlivan who have worked tirelessly towards this wonderful line up of bulls.

Paul Beamish is once again firing up the barbie with Three Rivers Beef and some Pork roasts that were a hit last year.

Due to time becoming available the morning of the sale we have both been busy organising the "East Coast Angus Bull Buyers Bull Breakfast" sponsored by Bayleys at the Tatapouri Sports Fishing Club. A warm welcome is sent out to all our clients, agents and friends who are planning on participating at the East Coast sales this year. a good muzzle, extreme depth and width, a perfect udder and lovely temperament.


Avenger himself carries all of these traits along with a great spread of numbers, which we expect to strengthen with more progeny on the way.

NATIVE RIPARIAN PLANTINGS



This winter we are planting the final block of the Turihaua Stream up to the west boundary with 4500 native trees. 2500 of these natives are funded as a part of the Trees that Count Queens Jubilees celebration. Over the past 5 years we have been grateful for support from Trees that Count and MPI1 Billion trees enabling us to plant 13,000 native trees along the Turihaua Stream banks. Support and planting efforts from Nigel and Lana Hope at the Makaraka Native Garden Nursery has been invaluable. The specimens they produce are locally eco-sourced with clusters of our favourites Kahikatea, Totara, Puriri and Rimu being planted in broader

areas away from the flood zone and more robust species like Cabbage Trees, Manuka, Purei and flaxes in the flood zones.

Sarah has been on the Steering Committee involved in the initiation of a Whangara Catchment Group. The scope of this group is very exciting with plans of seeking funding for widespread collective pest control, estuarine restoration, endangered sea bird enclosures and bush restoration. Natures boundary is not limited to legal ones so we are right behind this regional initiative and see how the biodiversity can flourish further on our property, upstream and the wider community.

2021 BULL SALE RESULTS



Thank you to all the purchasers and under-bidders at our June 2021 sale. 63 rising two-year-old bulls were sold with a sale average of \$9285, 26 were purchased for five figures. It was a solid line-up of bulls right through the catalogue and no one went away empty handed. We appreciate the continued support for our program from Meadowslea Genetics purchasing Lot 48 and Lot 54 and Ratanui Angus purchasing Lot 38 and look forward to how these bulls will breed into the future.

The Spring Sale was steady with 21 out of 24 yearling bulls sold with a top price of \$6200, two selling at that price, and a sale average for the yearlings of \$4047. All nine of the two-year-olds put up sold, for a top price of \$6000, and an average of \$5278.

There were good heifer mating options right through the catalogue. The bulls showed the disposition and types we are looking to breed.



Completeness of Recording

Herds with a star rating of "5" are gold standard. They are considered to be recording "complete" performance information with BREEDPLAN for all animals across all traits for which EBVs are available.

The team at Turihaua work tirelessly to record and submit as much information as possible about our cattle. Therefore, it is no coincidence to have been awarded a GOLD STAR rating every year since the inception of "Completeness of Performance."

The "Completeness of Performance" herd rating system assesses the quantity of pedigree and performance information that has been submitted to BREEDPLAN by an individual seedstock herd.

While ultimately EBV accuracy values provide an indication of the reliability an animal's EBVs, one of the key factors underpinning the accuracy of EBVs is the quantity of performance information that has been recorded with BREEDPLAN. The "Completeness of Performance" star rating provides both seedstock and commercial producers with an assessment of how much performance has been submitted to BREEDPLAN by a herd.
